

HOLIDAY SCIENCE FUN

MAKE YOUR OWN SECRET MESSAGE INK!

Do you want to write your password down so that no one can see it, or do you want to send someone a secret message?

Have fun with science these holidays when you make your own secret message ink with ingredients from your kitchen.
Ask an adult for help.

Things You'll Need

- Lemon juice
- Water
- Small bowl
- Spoon
- Cotton swab, toothpick or
- paintbrush White paper
- Light bulbBaking soda
- Baking sodWater
- WhiskPaintbrush
- Milk
- Grape juice concentrate
- · White crayon
- Watercolor paints
- Brush

Tips

- If you don't have a white crayon, you can substitute a white candle to make your invisible ink message. Then, paint over the writing with watercolors just as you would if you'd used a crayon.
- To read a message written with lemon juice or milk, you can also place the paper under a piece of cloth and iron the cloth to reveal your message. Alternatively, place the paper in a 350 F (177 C) oven for a few minutes until the message appears.
- For the white crayon method you don't have to paint over it. Take the paper, hold it up to a window in the day while it's a bit slanted. It isn't the most visible, but you can still read it just fine and it's a lot more simple.

Warnings

Be careful not to start a fire or burn yourself when heating your message.

Method 1 Lemon Juice Invisible Ink

Squeeze the juice of half of a lemon into a bowl. Add a few drops of water. Stir. Dip a cotton swab into the mix and write a message on a piece of white paper. Allow the message to dry. It will disappear. Hold the message over a light bulb until the message reappears.

Method 2 Baking Soda Invisible Ink

Mix 1/4 cup (60 ml) of baking soda with 1/4 cup (60 ml) of water in a small bowl. Dip a cotton swab into the mix and write a message on a white piece of paper with it. Let it dry. With a paintbrush paint some grape juice over your message and it will appear.

Method 3 Milk Invisible Ink

Dip a cotton swab into a shallow dish of milk and then write a message onto a white piece of paper. Allow the milk to dry.

Place the paper over a light bulb. The milk will heat up at a slower rate than the paper, causing the message to reappear.

Method 4 White Crayon Invisible Message

Use a white crayon to write a message onto a white piece of paper. Paint over the message using watercolours and a brush. The message will reappear.
