Reports

Early last week families received information regarding Semester 1 reports. Below is a summary of key points:

- Families can access the report online through the Parent Access Module (PAM). Passwords for this were re-distributed with this letter.
- Families who cannot access the report online can request a printed copy. It is important that this is done prior to Student / Teacher / Parent interviews.
- Once they have read the report, families are asked to complete the 'Response to Semester 1 Report' and to return this to the College by **Monday 27 July**.
- Student / Teacher / Parent interviews will take place next week on Tuesday 28 July and Thursday 30 July. Interviews need to be booked through PAM.
- Students need to attend with their families and to see their pastoral care teacher first and then other teachers as required.

Early Dismissal

Families are reminded that students will be dismissed at 2.15 pm on Tuesday 28 July and Thursday 30 July as we have Student / Parent / Teacher interviews on these days.

Congratulations

In looking through the reports it is good to see that most students are working hard and giving 100% in their studies. Congratulations to everyone who can say that they've done their best. This is what true excellence is about and there's nomore anyone can ask of you. I'm sure that you feel a strong sense of a job well done and that your families are very proud of all you've achieved. I'd encourage you to build on this during second semester.

Doing your best

A small number of students and their families would be disappointed with their Semester 1 results. Typically, these students leave things to the last minute, do as little as possible in class, are disorganised and begin work in the last few days before the end of semester.

For students who are keen to improve there are many avenues of help available, both at home and at school. Think about the following:

- If you have difficulty with organisation and planning, ask your family, hom eroom teacher or year level leader for help as they are more than happy to assist.
- If you find it hard to understand the work, see your subject teacher at lunchtime or after school. They are only too happy to give extra help.
- If you struggle with homework, Study Support is your answer. It runs from 3.05 – 4.15pm on Mondays to Wednesdays.
- If you struggle with reading, see Ms Vassallo for additional support.
- If you lack motivation, a chat with Jenny might help.
- If a lack of direction is the problem, an appointment with Mrs Dykes, our Careers Teacher, might do the trick. A clear career goal / plan might just help to get you back on track.

How often dowe hear people saying they wish they'd worked harder in the previous year, in a particular subject or at school in general? I hope that there are few, if any, students with this regret at the end of the year. Everyone can achieve their personal best but it does require you to work hard!

Parking restrictions around the school
