## Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school

## Working Together to Combat Cyberbullying

In July the Australian Government introduced the 'Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner'. One of the first tasks of the eSafety Commissioner was to set up a Cybersafety complaints scheme. The key purpose of this scheme is to facilitate the rapid removal of serious cyberbullying material from social media sites.

Following are the key steps in reporting cyberbullying material:

If content is not removed in 48 hours.....

- 1 Report the cyberbullying material to the social media service
- 2 Collect evidence - copy URLs or take screenshots of the material
- Report it to www.esafety.gov.au/cyberbullying-complaint
- Block the person and talk to someone you can trust.


