They are travelling with a group of 111 students and 30 teachers from the Archdiocese of Melbourne. As well as attending a week of activities in Krakow, they will be making a pilgrimage the Shrine of the Black Madonna in Czestochowa and post-World Youth Day will participate in a retreat at Wisla, in the Polish mountains.

World Youth Day events include three days of Catechesis with English-speaking Bishops from around the world, a Papal welcome, Stations of the Cross and an overnight vigil which culminates in the World Youth Day mass with Pope Francis on Sunday 31 July, 2016.

The grand final for the VCC championship ended up a rematch between CRC and Flinders Rangers Tyrabb. Neither side was willing to give an inch as the score board traded blows through out the game. Flinders Ranges'

defensive style got them in foul trouble in the second half, which sent CRC to line for bonus free throws in the critical last minutes of the final, ultimately emerging victorious by 4 points again and claiming the title of VCC champions for 2016.
