Review of the Year 8 Programme

We are currently reviewing the Year 8 programme to see how well it meets the needs of students and to identify areas for further development in light of the new Victorian curriculum. During Term 2 all Year 8 students had the opportunity to give feedback about what they valued in their learning. Following is a summary of key themes. Some of these are already happening and need to be maintained, others are opportunities for growth.

Year 8 2016 students want:

- to learn and have a thirst for knowledge;
- to be engaged in tasks that are practical, relevant, interactive and interesting (authentic learning);
- to be appropriately challenged and supported in their learning (differentiated learning);

- to work in groups and enjoy a positive atmosphere with classmates / friends;
- more active learning; new experiences, excursions, projects and experiments, and
- a voice in their learning.

I thank all Year 8 students for their input. It has been invaluable to the staff as they explore directions for future development. I am sure that families will agree that there is much wisdom in their responses.

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Our school community garden is proud to announce that we have formally partnered with Zea Hungry Goods to expand our school composting program to include our food waste from the staff room, food technology and from the school yard.

Zea have provided more than \$1000 worth of equipment in the form of worm farms and live worms, in return for our year 8 participate students recording by weight all of our school waste that goes into the worm farm systems.

Zea is a social enterprise business that focus on preventing food waste, soil loss and lack of access to fresh food by selling fair trade clothing and other items that come with a quarantee that each purchase composts 10 kilos of food waste. To date we have looked at the following Spiritual Acts of Mercy:


FORGIVENESS


