Good evening students, teachers and families, my name is Tina and today I will talking to you about our Year 10 work experience. To kick start our semester, Year 10s were given the opportunity to do work experience for a whole week. Work experience gave us the chance to develop employability skills, to explore possible career options, understand employer expectations and increase our self-understanding, maturity and independence. Our work experience placements were organised with the help of our Career Coordinator Mr Orsini and Year 10 Coordinator Mr Ramos. I believe I speak on behalf of the Year 10s when I say work experience was not what we expected it to be. Early mornings, busy traffic, memorising product names, greeting customers, running up and down aisles... Some of us worked in a team environment, others worked independently. Either way, it was completely out of our comfort zone. It was a week in the shoes of an adult.

I was given the chance to work at Chemist Warehouse, Highpoint! There I was briefly trained in how to take in prescriptions, tag products, assist customers, face the shelves and know which product belonged to which aisle. Overall, work experience was tiring but a rewarding experience. The skills and training I've developed through work experience, I will definitely take to my VCE years ahead and beyond.
