At the College we have a very smart uniform and it is important that students wear it correctly, neatly and proudly. Please carefully read over our Uniform Policy to assist in getting ready for the beginning of the year.

Ordering Uniforms

Our uniform supplier is Academy Uniforms and they are located at: 10/85 Derrimut Road, Deer Park.

Due to the strict COVID-19 restrictions, parents/guardians are required to make an appointment via the link below to attend the Deer Park store to purchase your child's uniform for 2022.

The dates available are as follows: Friday 10th December Thursday 16th December

Appointments are for 20 minutes and bookings can be made between 3pm and 8pm. These bookings are exclusive to CRC St Albans families.

All items of uniform (including school bag) need to be purchased through Academy Uniforms as they have the College logo in some form.

Information you might need for the first few days...

Canteen and Lunch Orders.

The College canteen is open before school for breakfast items, at recess and at lunchtime. To avoid the hassle of queues we advise students order their lunch. This is done at the canteen in the morning or at recess. Orders are collected via the express lane at lunchtime.

First Aid

Online Medical Forms will need to be completed, your family will receive instructions on how to do this. It is important to notify the school if you have a medical condition, asthma, anaphylaxis or any allergies.

Absences

Families are asked to ring the school before 10am if their son / daughter is to be absent for the day. After this time the Office staff call families if parents/guardians have not contacted the school. This task is reduced if families ring first.

If students are late to school or need to leave early they must report to the Office with a note from their parents on arriving or prior to leaving.



Getting ready for Day 1, Tuesday 1 February 2022

It's important that students name all belongings; including uniform, books, folders, pens, schoolbag, and other equipment before the beginning of the school year.

The College is a bigger place than your primary school and you move around a fair bit. Belongings can easily be lost or misplaced.

With textbooks you need to put your name in more than one place. A secret page is a good idea!

What if I lose something?

If everything is named it will be much easier to get it back to you. Always ask at the Office if you have lost something; and hand anything you find to a teacher or to the staff in the Office.

Tips for Starting Secondary School

Students have much to look forward to when starting a new school. But there are also worries. Getting lost, lockers, making new friends and managing with different teachers, timetables and classes are just some concerns you might have. Transition is a year long process, not just the work of a few days. Don't forget, all you've learnt in primary school will have prepared you well for this change. Keep asking questions as this will really help in getting to know how things work....here are some (with answers) to start the process:

Remember that you are not the only person starting secondary school and that nearly every person doing the same thing is feeling a little like you.

1....but I don't know my way around?

The single most important bit of advice is that if you don't know something - don't hesitate to ask. Everyone at the school is really friendly and willing to help. All staff and students watch out for Year 7 students. We don't expect you to know everything on the first day. We can also remember from our own experiences that it is not easy being in a new place!

2.....will I know someone?

If you have friends coming from your primary school, or you already have friends or brothers and sisters at the school, think about coming with them, at least on the first day to make sure you know where to go.

3.....how will I get to know people?

Don't forget all new students are 'in the same boat'. Introduce yourself to someone you don't know. They will probably appreciate it and then you will both know one new person.

4.....bring lunch in the first few weeks.

This will mean you don't have to worry about things like the canteen in the first few days. With all the new things to learn and do, you can probably do without this

5.....how will my family know where to pick me up?

Make sure that if a member of your family is picking you up after school that they know where you will meet at the end of the day. We suggest the Hall on Orientation Day.

6....meeting new friends.

The school has many activities to help you get to know new people. As the year goes along, get involved in school activities (music, sport, debating) then you will automatically meet a group of new students with the same interests.

7....if you don't know where else to go for help.

Head to the front Office. There will always be someone there who can help you out.
