What you need to know

If you are not experiencing COVID-19 symptoms you can continue to attend school, but you should monitor for symptoms.

Staff who show symptoms of COVID-19 cannot attend school and should get tested immediately and isolate until they receive a negative result.

Staff and students should continue with twice-a-week rapid antigen testing on school days.

Staff who have recovered from COVID-19 do not need to participate in surveillance testing for 30 days after their isolation period has ended. For information on symptoms visit:

If you return a positive result, you have COVID-19, and you must:

- quarantine for seven days
- advise the school about the positive result
- stay home until your symptoms have resolved and you are well
- Everyone in your household is a close contact and must isolate for 7 days.

Reporting your positive test

If you were at school when you were infectious you must let me know.

You must also report your positive result to the Department of Health via the COVID-19 Positive [Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form](#) or call centre on 1800 675 398.
